WHAT IS TITLE IF

Part of the Elementary and Secondary
Education Act, currently known as No Child
Left Behind (NCLB), Title I is a federal
entitlement program that provides the district
and schools serving low income families with
funds to improve student achievement. District
and school allocations are based on the number
and percentage of students who are eligible for
free or reduced-price lunches. Moreover, the
purpose of Title I is to provide additional
academic assistance beyond the general
classroom to at-risk students.

PROGRAM DESIGN

Columbus Arts and Technology Academy has a Title I Schoolwide Program that focuses on reading and math intervenuons. The program is designed to supplement general classroom instruction using a variety of models:

- Push-in Title I support within the general classroom. This type of support assists Title I students in class and provides extra assistance in the same setting and time period as their peers.
- Limited pull-out sessions with Title I teachers and paraprofessionals. This support allows children to be seen outside the classroom (usually on a daily basis) for a limited period of time for intensive instruction using intervention curriculum.
