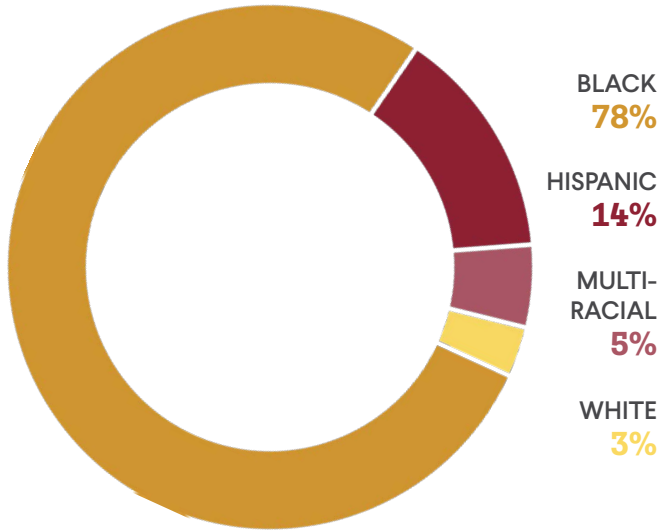

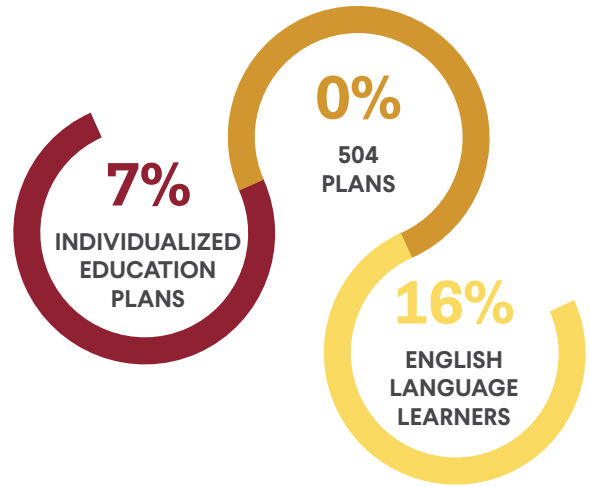

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS



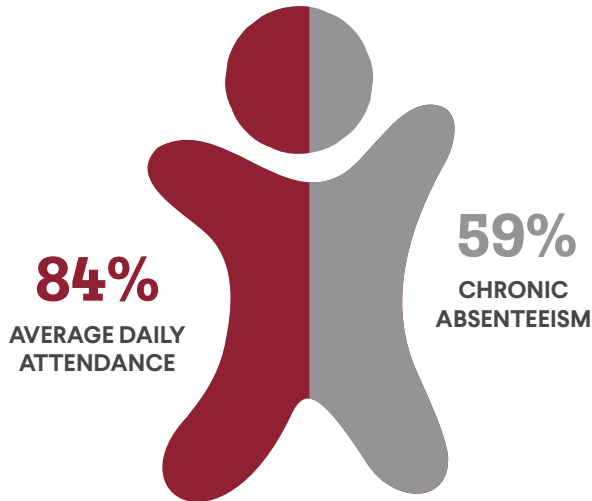

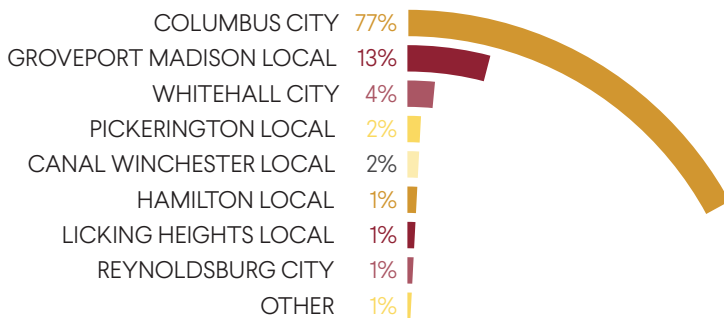

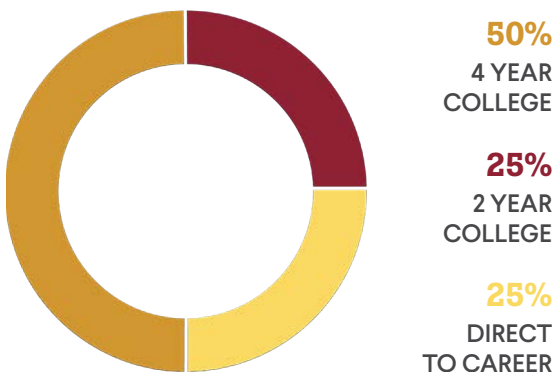

CLASS OF 2022

CATA's Class of 2022 included eight seniors. 100% graduated with three-quarters of the class planning to enroll in college or university. Two seniors planned to immediately pursue their career following specialized training and certification from CATA's CTE program. Seniors earned 72k dollars in scholarships, an average of 12k per college-bound graduate. All students were accepted to Columbus State Community College with one student now attending Wilberforce University, the nation's oldest private, historically black University owned and operated by African Americans.

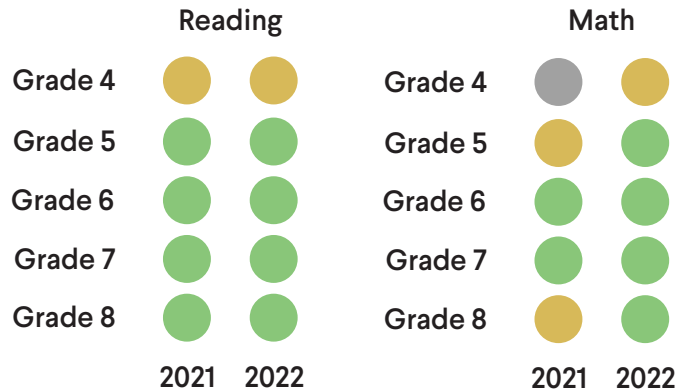
ACADEMIC PROGRESS

Through a well-rounded curriculum that engages students and instructional hours above state requirements, Columbus Arts & Technology Academy is undergoing steady academic recovery since the pandemic as measured by year-over-year student academic growth comparison (Progress component). Additionally, the school increased its Performance Index (PI) score by nearly 3%. 96.7% of students met the state literacy requirements to promote to Grade 4. 100% of the Class of 2022 met the requirements to graduate.

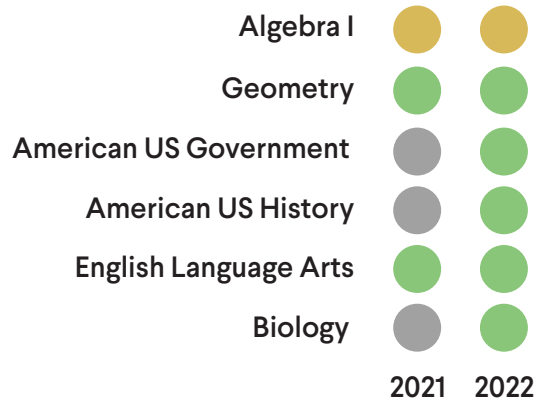
YOY GROWTH IN PERFORMANCE INDEX SCORE
